In Ontario, CLINICARE's Clinical Management System (CMS) Local Solution is certified by the ePhysician Project (ePP) to ensure that it supports the project's mandate to implement high quality, integrated and standardized IT solutions to automate physician practices. The ePhysician Project is jointly sponsored by the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care, the Ontario Medical Association and the Ontario Family Health Network.

In Alberta, CLINICARE's Systems operating on Windows/AIX in "Local" and in an ASP environment using MS Terminal Services have both met the Alberta Electronic Health Record (EHR) System-to-System (S2S) interoperability requirements. Interoperability deals explicitly with how CLINICARE's Systems communicate with the EHR managed by Alberta Wellnet. It establishes a base level of functionality in utilizing the information and features available in the EHR.

In addition, CLINICARE's Systems (Local and ASP) have successfully completed the functionality and performance requirements that are addressed by the Vendor Conformance and Usability Requirements (VCUR) program managed by Alberta's Physician Office System Program (POSP). In Phase 2 of the program, all Level 2 POSP physicians must select their Physician Office Systems (POS) from the VCUR Product List.

"Having met or exceeded all existing Canadian conformance requirements means that physicians can choose our Solutions with confidence", said Dennis Niebergal, president and CEO of CLINICARE. "It was interesting to note that conformance evaluators who were practicing physicians rated our Solutions even higher than their non-physician colleagues. We see this as proof that our software not only works, but it also provides real value to the practicing physician".
